Absentee Voting GE 2022

Wyoming absentee voting for the November 8, 2022 General Election has begun! If you are a registered voter and have not already requested an Absentee Ballot, you may do so at any time through November 7, 2022.

In Wyoming, no excuse is needed to request an Absentee Ballot. Absentee Ballots can be requested by contacting your County Clerk's Office by phone or in person or by filling out and mailing the form on the Secretary of State's website, <https://sos.wyo.gov/Forms/Elections/General/AbsenteeRequestForm-Standard.pdf>.

Be "Vote Ready" for the November 9 General Election by learning about your candidates then be sure to Cast your Ballot! Voter Registration GE 2022

Voter Registration in Wyoming is ongoing Monday through Friday until November 7th at local County Clerks' offices during their office hours. Voter registration can also be done on Election Day at your polling place between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. Any person wishing to register to vote in Wyoming or to make changes to their registration such as name, address, or party affiliation, can do so at these times.

Voters must be registered to vote before requesting an Absentee Ballot or voting at their polling place on election day. The easiest way to do this is to go to your County Clerk's office and bring your driver's license. If you do not have a driver's license, contact your county clerk's office to learn about other acceptable identifications. A notary public must witness your signature; the staff at the county clerk's office can do this. As mentioned above, you may also register or change your registration on election day at your polling place.

The League of Women Voters of Wyoming has provided questions to all candidates seeking a Wyoming state-wide office, a Wyoming state legislative office, or the Wyoming US House of Representatives office. These questions focus on issues important to Wyoming and related to the office candidates are seeking.
